The funeral took place at Aberystwyth crematorium where a large crowd had gathered paying respect, following the service members gathered at Plas Antaron with the family.


The RWF drape was placed over the coffin and the Aberystwyth Branch RWFCA provided the bearers.

Regimental Pioneers 3 R.W.F.

1980-1990 by Terry Weston

From 1980 to 1990 the Regimental Pioneers of the 3rd Battalion R.W.F. were provided by the Aberystwyth Platoon. They originally paraded in No 2 Dress, buckskin aprons from the inter war years, and with Pioneer tools probably last used during the Peninsular War.

As their turnout and drill improved they were fortunate to have as their R.S.M. W.O.1. (late Major) Glyn Hughes M.B.E. who provided encouragement and support.

Following an amicable (late night) discussion at Kinmel Camp the then Pioneer Sergeant agreed to grow a beard if the R.S.M. could obtain Scarlets. They both kept to their side of the brgain and over the years various other improvements were made to the kit. Plastic aprons replaced the old buckskin issue, busbies replaced berets, and the tools, mattock, axes, and shovels were professionally re-silvered. For the Tercentary Parade the Pioneer Sergeant was driven to London to be fitted for a brand new Scarlet jacket which cost £450. A far cry from the early days!

During the above decade the Pioneers together with the Goat and Corps of Drums provided colour, entertainment, spectacle, and precision drill at many events from the old Cardiff Arms Park to Amlwh and from Aberystwyth to Wrexham.

The Pioneers paraded at march pasts, freedom marches, tattoos, kape tours, carnivals, church parades, the official opening of the new T.A. Centres at Colwyn Bay and Wrexham and of course the big one, the Tercentenary Parade.

There was, of course, the odd hiccup. My personal favourite was when we went to take part in a carnival in Blaenau Ffestiniog. We paraded on the main street and marched to the local park where we performed our usual display with the Drums. We were surprised that the only people there were a couple of youngsters playing football and a man walking a mangy old dog. After the display we retired to the local R.W.F. Club. A member cam up to us and asked if the rehersal had gone well. We said we never rehearsed parades, just did them. "Well", he asked, "Will you be back next week when the actual event is to take place"?
